BERKS COUNTY KENNEL CLUB – CODE OF ETHICS
I/we will become amiliar with and will abide by the roles of the AKC and the AKC Standard for my breed(s) and the Constitution & By-Laws of the BCKC.
I/we shall not engage in the wholesaling of litters or of selling of stock to places such as pet dealers, pet shops, catalog hourses, auctions or other commercial sources of distribution. Nor shall I/we engage in the over breeding of my/our own bitches or dogs for profit with no regard for quality.
I/we will keep breeding and pedigree records accurate, complete and up-to-date according to AKC regulations.
I/we will provide proper registration applications to buyers unless other individual agreements have been made between the buyer and seller.
I/we will seek to do selective breeding by using studs or dams to reduce faults to a minimum and produce puppies of better type and quality. Dogs offered at public stud shall be used on purebred registered bitches.
All puppies and adults shall be sold in clean, healthy conditions and shall be old enough to make the necessary adjustment to a new home safely as per the PA dog law. No adult or puppy shall be sold without adequate protection against disease.
I/we will gauge my/our actions on the basis of the interests of the BCKC and of the dog fancy for the present and future.
